Scope and Content: 6 scrapbooks containing newspaper clippings pertaining to the removal of four aldermen from city council due to conflict of interest and the subsequent by-election. Also included are articles related to the land purchase between the CLE and Chapples Ltd., which was taking place at the same time as the conflict of interest case. The newspaper clippings come from the *Stirring Giant, Daily Times Journal*, and *News Chronicle*. Some original documents such as speech transcripts, agendas, and cheque receipts can also be found in some scrapbooks.

Series A 105/1/1-6: This consists of 6 scrapbooks, largely of newspaper clippings, arranged chronologically. On occasion there are documents that do not fit chronologically, however, they do relate to the material being displayed.

Biographical Information: Bert Badanai, son of the late Hubert Badanai, former Fort William mayor and Member of Parliament, is a former councilor for Port Arthur and the newly amalgamated Thunder Bay. He was a part of the council that was rocked by scandal in 1971-1972 over conflicts of interest. As the owner of a local car dealership, his dealings with the city were brought to light under the Municipal Act. This resulted in the loss of his seat on council. He held Liberal party affiliations and was a great ally to former mayor Saul Laskin.
